Jeremiah 29:4-14

¹This is the text of the letter that the prophet Jeremiah sent from Jerusalem to the surviving elders among the exiles and to the priests, the prophets and all the other people Nebuchadnezzar had carried into exile from Jerusalem to Babylon. ² (This was after King Jehoiachin and the queen mother, the court officials and the leaders of Judah and Jerusalem, the skilled workers and the artisans had gone into exile from Jerusalem.) ³ He entrusted the letter to Elasah son of Shaphan and to Gemariah son of Hilkiah, whom Zedekiah king of Judah sent to King Nebuchadnezzar in Babylon. It said:

⁴This is what the LORD Almighty, the God of Israel, says to all those I carried into exile from Jerusalem to Babylon: ⁵ "Build houses and settle down; plant gardens and eat what they produce. ⁶Marry and have sons and daughters; find wives for your sons and give your daughters in marriage, so that they too may have sons and daughters. Increase in number there; do not decrease. ⁷Also, seek the peace and prosperity of the city to which I have carried you into exile. Pray to the LORD for it, because if it prospers, you too will prosper." ⁸Yes, this is what the LORD Almighty, the God of Israel, says: "Do not let the prophets and diviners among you deceive you. Do not listen to the dreams you encourage them to have. ⁹They are prophesying lies to you in my name. I have not sent them," declares the LORD.

¹⁰ This is what the LORD says: "When seventy years are completed for Babylon, I will come to you and fulfill my good promise to bring you back to this place. ¹¹ For I know the plans I have for you," declares the LORD, "plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future. ¹² Then you will call on me and come and pray to me, and I will listen to you. ¹³ You will seek me and find me when you seek me with all your heart. ¹⁴ I will be found by you," declares the LORD, "and will bring you back from captivity. I will gather you from all the nations and places where I have banished you," declares the LORD, "and will bring you into exile."

<u>Set up</u>

- 597 BC the Babylonian King Nebuchadnezzar invaded Jerusalem.
- Destroyed the Temple and took many of the leaders back to his country.
- Babylon located in Iraq about 50 miles south of Bagdad was approx.
- Babylon is approx. 500 miles from Jerusalem.
- Birmingham to Orlando OR Birmingham to Indianapolis.

Three ways to go DEEPER!

I. <u>Grow where God plants me.</u>

Jeremiah 29:4

This is what the LORD Almighty, the God of Israel, says to all those I carried into exile from Jerusalem to Babylon:

- A. The Babylonians had done terrible things to the Jews.
 - 1. They had destroyed their city, ransacked their temple, ruined their economy, removed their leaders, and enslaved their populace.
 - 2. Babylon had done its worst to Jerusalem.

<u>Illustration</u>

- It is not surprising, then, that Saint Augustine (354–430) viewed Babylon as a symbol of evil.
- In his classic work *The City of God*, the great North African theologian described human history as a conflict between two great cities—the city of God and the city of Man.
- This race we have distributed into two parts, the one consisting of those who live according to man, the other of those who live according to God.
- And these we also mystically call the two cities, or the two communities of men, of which the one is predestined to reign eternally with God, and the other to suffer eternal punishment with the devil.
- Augustine later identified Babylon as the Biblical symbol of the city of Man.
- James Montgomery Boice's book *Two Cities, Two Loves* applies Augustine's insights to the post-Christian world:
 - According to St. Augustine, who gave us the distinction between "the two cities" ... Scripture unfolds the history of two distinct groups of people, each having a distinct origin, development, characteristics and destiny.
 - These are two cities or societies.
 - The earthly society has as its highest expression the city cultures of Babylon and ... Rome.
 - The other is the church, composed of God's elect.
 - The former is destined to pass away.
 - The latter is blessed by God and is to last forever.
 - To read Jeremiah 29 with the two cities in mind is to recognize that God's people were prisoners in the city of Satan.
 - They were refugees in Babylon, which represents everything hateful and odious to God.
 - B. Unpack Text
 - 1. God gives the Israelites specific directions.
 - 2. They are not in Jerusalem.
 - 3. They are away from the Temple.
 - 4. They are away from the sacrificial systems.
 - 5. They are away from what is comfortable and familiar.
 - 6. They are away from their usual way of worshipping.
 - 7. They were moved away from all of this.
 - C. Here are the specific instructions.
 - 1. Build houses and settle down.
 - 2. Plant gardens and eat what they produce.
 - 3. Marry and have children.
 - 4. Help your kids find a mate so they can marry.

- 5. Increase in number.
- 6. Do NOT decrease

Application

- Weave yourself into the culture where you live.
- Be part of the economy.

- Grow and advance your family.
- Whatever you do DO NOT decrease.
 - D. See the peace and prosperity of the city to which I have carried you into exile.
 - 1. Pray over your city.
 - 2. If it prospers you will prosper.
 - E. Everybody has a territory and everybody has a role.
 - 1. Discern the know how to pray for my territory.

1 Chronicles 4:10

Jabez cried out to the God of Israel, "Oh, that you would bless me and enlarge my territory! Let your hand be with me, and keep me from harm so that I will be free from pain." And God granted his request.

<u>Illustration</u>

- Where is your territory?
- What area does God want you to operate in and influence?

¹⁷ Nevertheless, each person should live as a believer in whatever situation the Lord has assigned to them, just as God has called them.

 ²⁴ Brothers and sisters, each person, as responsible to God, should remain in the situation they were in when God called them.

II. Listen and understand God's words to me.

I can hear and understand God's words to me. Not get distracted with wrong messages I need discernment to distinguish.
